(As of January 2013)

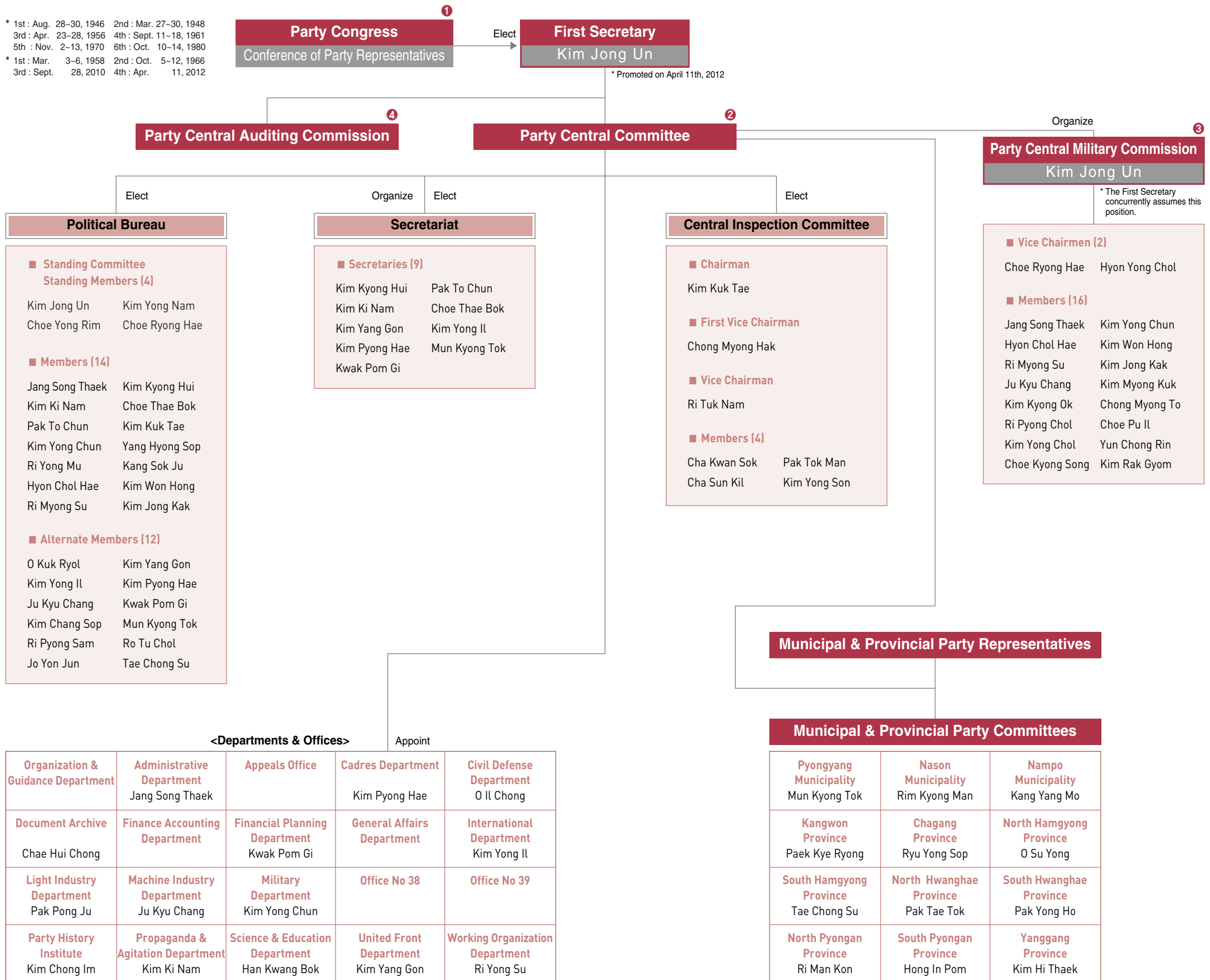

Party Organs

※ This leadership chart has been compiled based on the Korean Workers' Party rules, the outcome of the 4th Party Conference of the KWP held on April 11th, 2012 and North Korean media reports.

① The Party Congress and the Conference of the Party Representatives set party lines and implement policies, adopt creeds and rules, select the First Secretary of the KWP, and discuss all kinds of party affairs and projects.

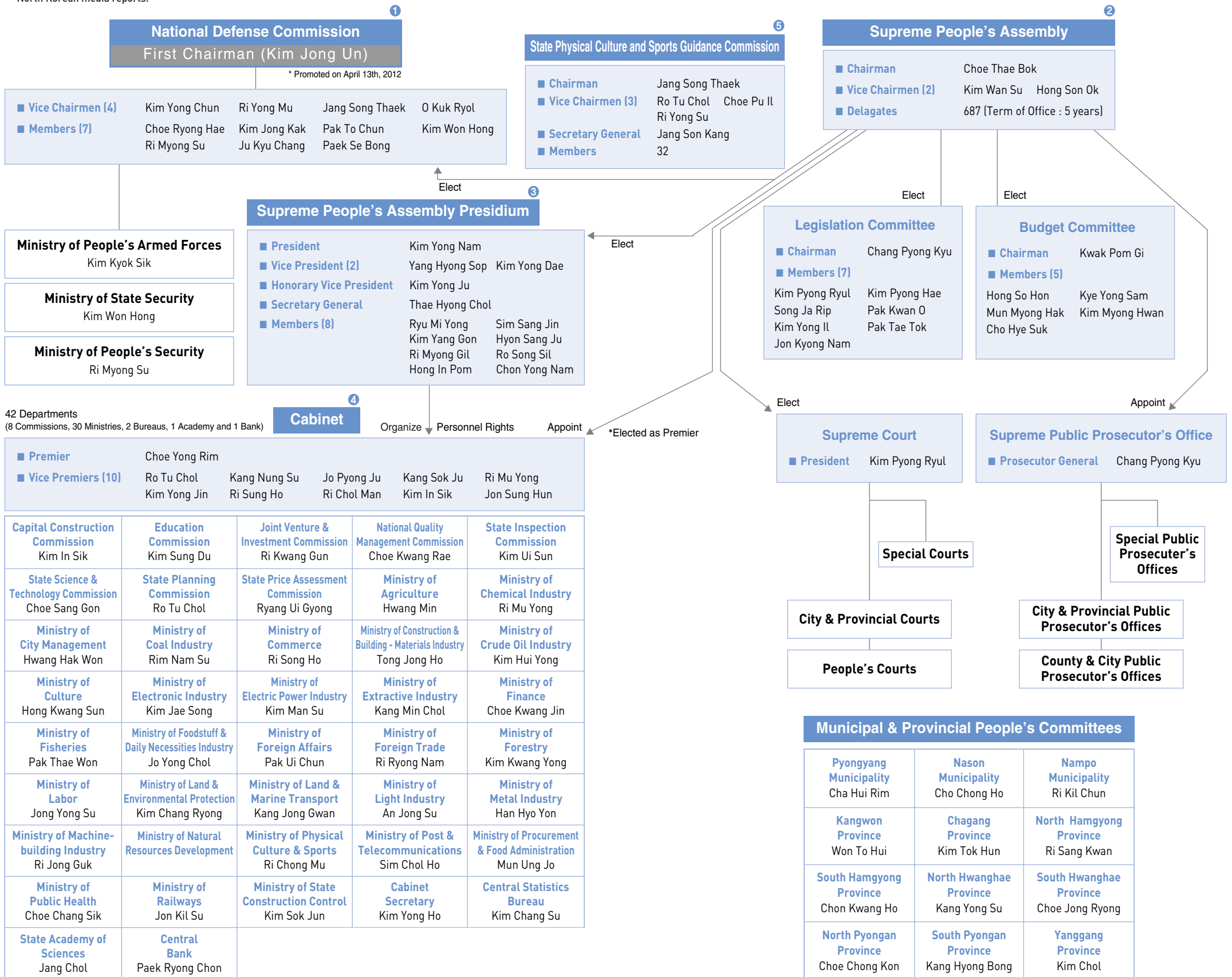
② The Central Committee of the KWP supervises and organizes all party affairs and manages finances. (It assembles all members at least more than once a year.)
 - Political Bureau: Overseeing and organizing all party affairs
 - Secretariat: Discussing and making decisions over internal affairs, coordinating and supervising project implementation
 - Central Inspection Committee: inspecting party rules and regulations

③ The Party Central Military Commission coordinates and supervises all military projects and implements military policies and supervises all national defense matters.

④ The Party Central Auditing Commission inspects the Party's financial management.

Government Organs

※ This leadership chart has been compiled based on the DPRK's Socialist Constitution, the outcome of the 12th Supreme People's Assembly's 5th plenary meeting held on April 13th, 2012 and 6th plenary meeting held on September 25th, 2012 and North Korean media reports.



① The First Chairman of the National Defense Commission guides nation-wide projects, appoints officials in the area of national defense, discards ratification of treaties, and mobilizes order in case of emergency.

② The Supreme People's Assembly legislates, amends, and supplements the Constitution and all laws and regulations and establishes basic principles for foreign and domestic policies.

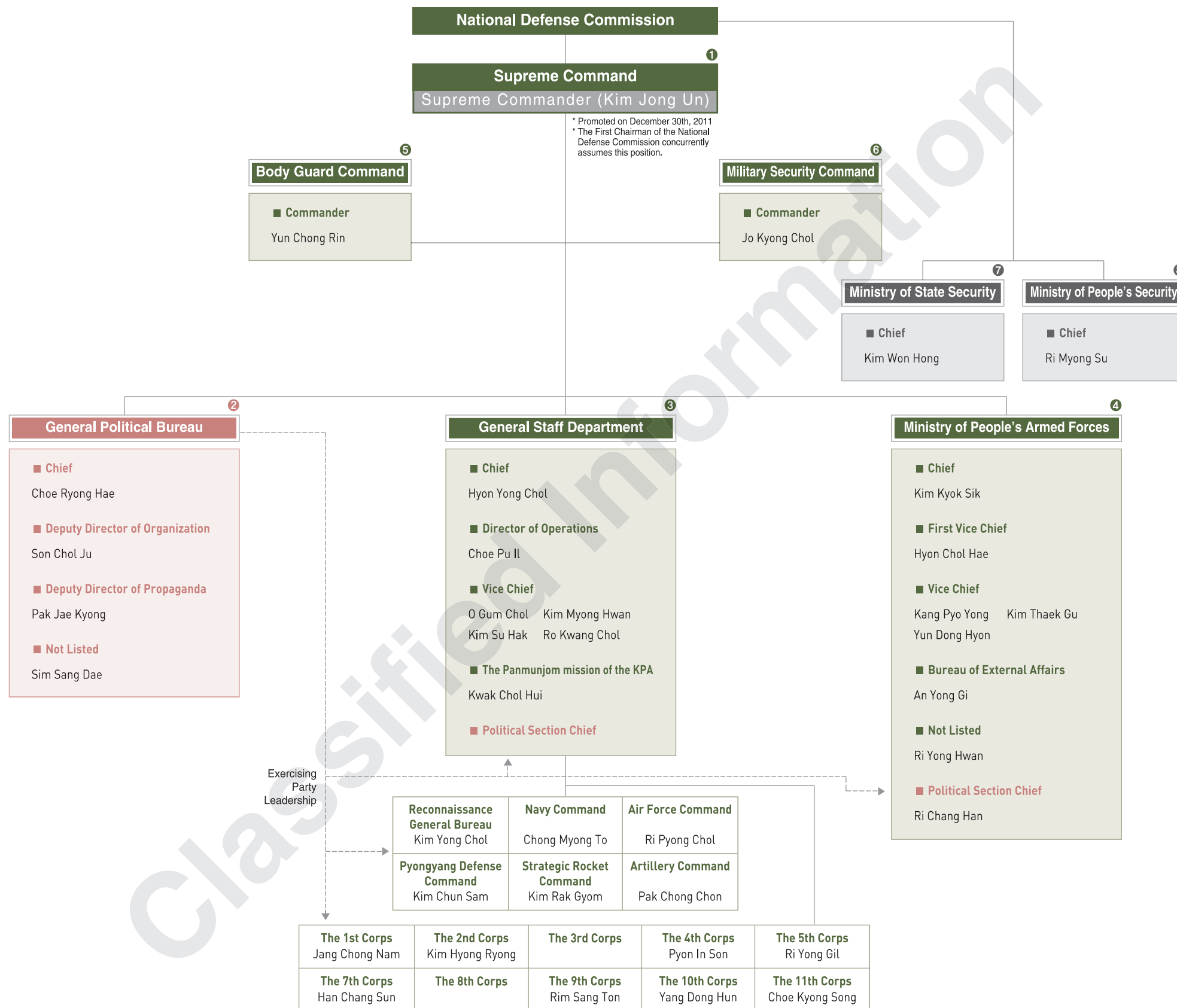
③ The Supreme People's Assembly Presidium supplements laws according to department and oversees all organs whether or not they observe law.

④ The Cabinet enforces national policies and carries out all administrative work including budget planning.

⑤ The State Physical Culture and Sports Guidance Commission is an institute that oversees physical cultures and sports activities on a national scale. It is responsible for popularizing sports games among ordinary people, improving sports science, training athletes and invigorating sports games.

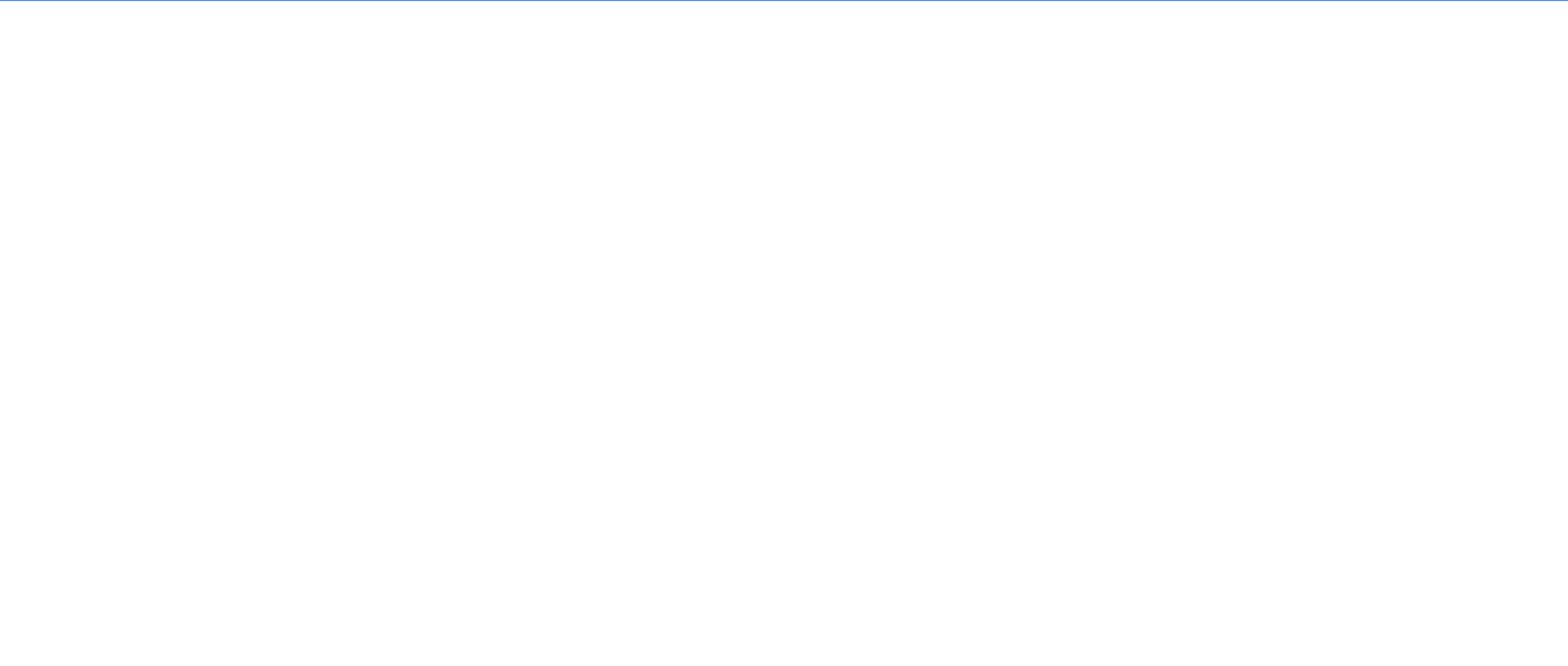
Military Organs

※ This leadership chart has been compiled based on information provided by North Korean media.



- ① The Supreme Commander commands all military activities of North Korea's armed forces.
 ② The General Political Bureau carries out all political affairs within the military and regulates military operation orders.
 ③ The General Staff Department (GSD) commands military forces at large and oversees military operations and training.
 ④ The Ministry of People's Armed Forces carries out all activities and affairs related to munitions, equipments, construction, military diplomacy and civil defense.

- ⑤ The Body Guard Command is responsible for guarding Kim Jong-un, his family, their official residences, special areas like personal villas and the *Kumsusan* Palace of the Sun.
 ⑥ The Military Security Command cracks down on dissidents within the Korea People's Army and prevents espionage.
 ⑦ The Ministry of State Security tracks down and handles spies, dissidents and prisoners to secure the regime. It also collects information about South Korea and commits sabotage against South Korea.
 ⑧ The Ministry of People's Security watches and punishes all anti-state activities, controls and investigates ordinary citizens and maintains public order.
